Soil samples, about a tablespoon, should be taken from several locations and combined in a container. Individual areas such as a vegetable garden, perennial bed, etc. can be tested separately if you choose.

2006 FALL PLANT LIST

PERENNIALS

1. **Euphorbia polychrome** - “Bonfire” - The name says it all, describing its colorful foliage of purple, red and orange. The “crackling” yellow bracts for several weeks in late spring intensify the most colorful cushion spurge to hit the market. Like lots of new plants on the market, this one too is about the foliage, the flowers are an added attraction. Easy to grow and neat habit at 18". Another container possibility. Sun or light shade. **Bareroot/\$6.00**
2. **Daylily - Dragon’s Eye** - Pale rose/pink flower petals with ruffled edges have prominent intense rose/red eye covering most of the flower. Well branched flower scapes reward with flowers over many weeks in summer. Always an easy grower, without fuss in full sun. Ht. 24". **Bareroot/\$6.00**
3. **Daylily - Pretty in Pink** - Fragrant, blue/pink flowers with deep green throat produced for many weeks in early to mid-summer. A strong easy grower in full sun. A tall gal at 27". **Bareroot/\$6.00**
4. **Monarda didyma - Bee Balm** - With the name like “Grand Marshall” this one should be impressive. And this new series offers exceptional hardiness. A flurry of fuchsia-purple flowers bloom mid to late summer. Because it is smaller in stature, reaching only 13-16", you can expect perky upright flowers attracting butterflies, bees and hummingbirds. Perfect for cutting. Sun for the best performance. **Bareroot/\$5.00**
5. **Sedum - Black Jack** - A great cut flower with 8" brilliant pink flower heads late summer. Upright habit, its broad black/purple foliage a striking contrast planted amid your

other sedum and ornamental grasses. Easy full sun grower tolerating heat, drought and poor soil. Butterflies love it!

6. **Spiderwort -Tradescantia** - “Perinne’s Pink” - I love my purple, but these pale pink flowers on slender frosted blue-green leaves should be stunning. Long blooming, they are great for naturalizing the wildflower garden and command attention at over 2ft. Full sun to part shade. **Bareroot/\$5.00**
7. **Veronica longifolia** “Sonja” - speedwell - Tall upright pink flower spikes with no staking required. Less work more enjoyment. Foliage is glossy green and forms a dense clump allowing flower and foliage to work in unison for a fantastic presentation all summer. Try it in containers. Ht 26-30" with equal spread. **Bareroot/\$5.00**

DAFFODILS, TULIPS & SPECIALTY BULBS

8. **Daffodil “Dutch Master”** - What would our sale be without this favorite. The largest flower with the largest trumpet and pure yellow color is the perfect hello to spring. Great display and excellent for cutting. Stands to about 20". **Bag 32/\$10.00**
9. **Double Delicious Daffodil Blend** - Golds, oranges, yellows and shades in between. Add a more elegant look to the spring garden and have a vase ready for these ruffled centered bright eyed beauties Petals are double as well. Abundant blossoms in April and May every year as these will naturalize. Ht. 12-20" in a sunny to shady location. **Bag 15/\$10.00**

10. **Daffodils - Mixed** - A bit less showy than the double blend offering similar colors in more traditional form. Single trumpets in maze of colors. Ht to 20". **Bag32/\$10.00**

Have you admired the striking presence of tall bearded irises in late May through June and wished you had some?

The colors, stature and simple elegance in the garden make these a must have for everyone. And, they are easier to grow than you think. Requiring full sun and room to breathe, they are dependable and long lived. Instructions at pickup.

11. **Iris pallida - variegata** - A fragrant June blooming iris, parent to the popular tall bearded varieties - at 3ft in the sunny garden this tough perennial will reward with variegated foliage that enhances its purple flowers of heavenly fragrance. **Bareroot/\$5.00**
12. **Dwarf Iris - Dandafore - yellow** - Neon yellow species heirloom (1876) blooming late Jan-early Feb. Excellent fragrance for rock garden or border. Ht to 6-8" in full sun to shade. Naturalizes to create needed winter perk. **Bag 15/\$5.00**
13. **Bearded Iris - "Lady Friend"** - Garnet rose blossoms early. Excellent habit to 36". **\$4.00**
14. **Bearded Iris - City Lights** - Intense blue color with white spots in the center of the standards and falls. White beards. It is fragrant and will rebloom with removal of old blooms and stalks. What a dramatic statement this would make in the spring garden. Ht 36-37". **\$4.00**
15. **Sensation - Purple Allium** - Excellent cut or dried flower!. Hundreds of tiny purple flowers compressed into a 4" round ball on 24-36" stem. Reliable bloomer adding interest to mid-late spring garden. Leave the spent blooms for added interest. **Bag 10/\$5.00**
16. **Wood Hyacinth** - Hyacinthoides - Campanulata - wild mix of pastels - white, pink and blue - on 15-18" stems in April-May. Sun to shade and deer proof naturalizer. **Bag 15/\$6.00**
17. **Striped squill - Puschkinia libanotica** - Pale blue bell shaped flowers with white stripes. Small cutting flower for rock garden or border at 6-8". Full sun and deer proof naturalizer. **Bag 15/\$5.00**
18. **Spring Star Flower - Ipheion 'Rolph Fiedler'** - Star shaped lavender/blue flowers with white centers and edges in April-May. Low growing, grassy foliage, will multiply each year and flowers for months! Ht 3-5" in sun to shade. Excellent companion to daffodils and deer proof as well. **Bag15/\$5.00**
19. **Valentine Candy Tulip Collection** - Collection of three reds, blooming late spring offering excellent fragrant cut flowers. Tulips are easy to grow and worth the effort of digging a few small holes for the reward you reap in spring. Use Coast of Maine bulb mix to keep away critters - proven to do the job. **Bag15/\$10.00**
20. **Heavenly Blend** - Collection of **Jack Snipe** cyclamineus daffodil with reflexive petals of white and yellow cup, one-three flowers per 10" stem, bright blue-almost purple 'Atlantic' **Hyacinth** and blue **muscaria** for pleasing early spring attention. Perfect combination - fragrance, cutting capability and deer proof! These will look stunning in your garden. Sun to part shade. **Bag 45/\$10.00**

WOODLAND WALLFLOWERS

21. **May Apple - Podophyllum peltatum** - Grows well in shaded locations under deciduous trees. A single creamy white wax like flower can be found under its enormous two leaves. Often referred to as the umbrella plant due to its appearance prior to its leaves opening in spring. Fall planting is best in moist wooded location. Easy to grow perennial that spreads from creeping rhizomes. Blooms late April-May. **Bag10 rhizomes/\$8.00**
22. **Virginia Bluebells - Mertensia virginica** - Breathtaking blue. Easy to grow and will naturalize over the years for a truly remarkable spring groundcover. Part shade works best. Blooms for weeks in May into June. A must if you don't have this. **Bag10/\$8.00**
23. **Wild Ginger - Asarum canadense** - Reliable native groundcover 9-12" with brown bell flowers on mildly fragrant large heart shaped leaves. Naturalizes in the shady garden and provides attractive groundcover for the season. Deciduous. **Bag10/\$8.00**

SHRUBS

24. **Viburnum nudum - Winterhur** - This selection from Winterthur Gardens in Delaware is a 5-7 ft. shrub growing best in part shade. White flowers in mid to late spring are followed by berries that run the gamut of colors, green, white, pink, blue and black. Sometimes all at once! Reddish purple fall leaves may last through winter. Upright, compact habit. Likes our mostly acidic soil and will be perfect in a natural garden. **Half gallon container/\$8.00**
